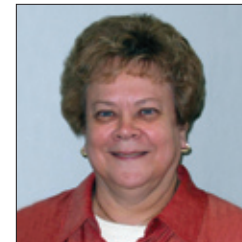

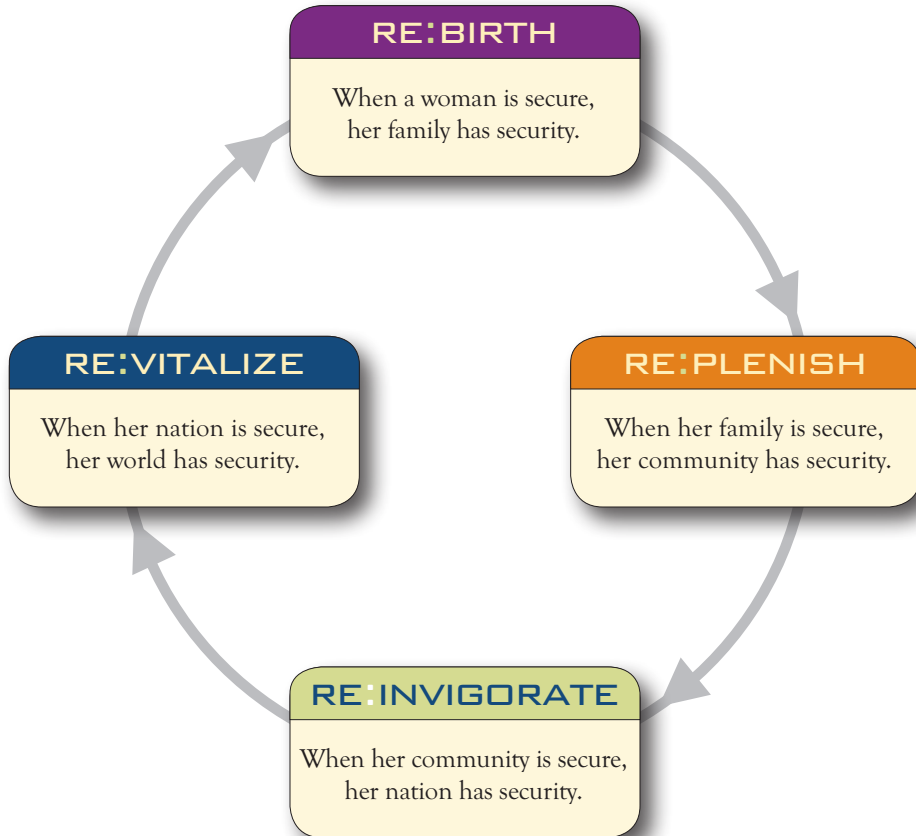

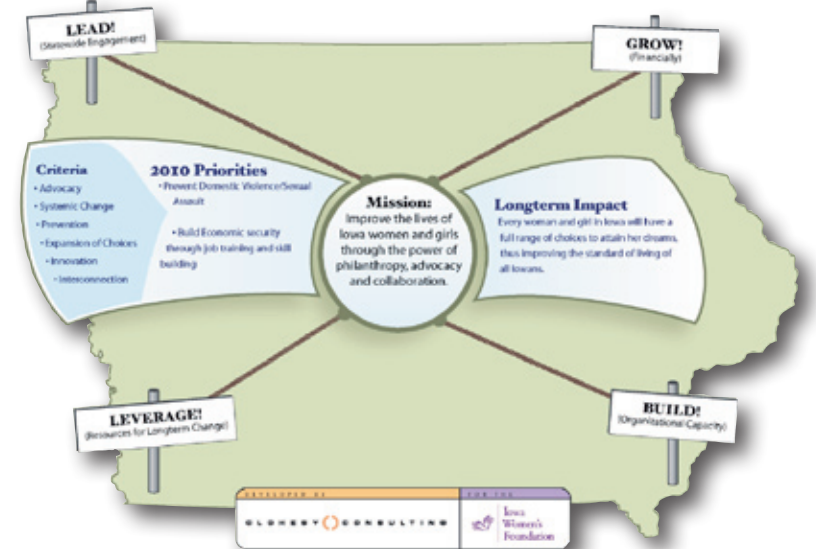

Form follows function . . . In 2008, IWF emerged with a new office, new Web site, new board members and new staff. Thanks to support from Adams & Baumbach Associates PC and a partnership with Johnson County Heritage Trust, IWF relocated to a 1,000-square-foot office (eight times larger) without increasing our rental costs.

With new office furniture and a phone system, donated by Johnson County Public Health and Johnson County Empowerment, IWF now has the tools to increase volunteer and community engagement. Learn more at our new Web site, www.iawf.org, designed by Small Dot Studios.

New IWF board members bring extensive fundraising experience, leadership skills and regional connections. Peggy Doerge, Katherine Moyers, Pat Schnack and Mettie Thomopoulos joined the IWF Board in January 2009.

IWF staff is led by executive director Dayna Ballantyne, who graduated from interim to executive director in March 2009. Dayna holds a master's degree from the University of Michigan in social work with an emphasis in nonprofit management and community organizing. She has demonstrated success in designing, developing and financing programs that meet community needs.

Rachael Jensen provides staffing support as a part-time office manager. Rachael earned a degree in entrepreneurship and music business from Bradley University in Peoria, Illinois, and has a background in marketing and fund raising.

IWF founder Holly Hotchkiss provides project support, drawing on her University of Iowa degree in business and extensive accounting background.

2009 GRANT PROCESS

This year the Iowa Women's Foundation will implement the Making the Case evaluation process, which demonstrates how grant dollars create and sustain positive social change. Making the Case was developed by the Women's Funding Network and is used successfully by foundations around the world. The model will benchmark grantee data with other women's funding groups to enhance program outcomes and increase the impact of future grant cycles. RE:RESULTS

2008 GRANT PARTNERS

(Y)WISE GIRLS “GIRLS CIRCLE” PROGRAM, CLINTON: \$2,150

Using IWF funding, the YWCA Clinton was able to purchase and institute the “Girls Circle” curriculum for their (Y)Wise Girls program. Since the new curriculum was established, more than 75 girls have participated in the group, including some who are homeless or in transitional housing. The program provides a foundation for a positive self-image, healthy relationships and community engagement in a welcoming and accepting setting. Program leaders are expanding the program into schools, and report continued engagement among participating girls.

REAL IMPACT: (Y)WISE GIRLS LEARN TO TRANSCEND STRESS OF HOMELESSNESS.

“Through our curriculum we have studied the importance of meditation, and were able to hire a meditation specialist to come in and do a program with our girls. Through that program our girls have developed a sense of calm in a very uncomfortable situation!”

IOWA JUVENILE HOME “TRUE COLORS MUSIC THERAPY PROJECT,” TOLEDO: \$5,000

This IWF grant supported the third year of programming for the True Colors project at the Iowa Juvenile Home (IJH). The home serves girls from all areas of Iowa who are victims of abuse, sexual abuse and neglect, including many who have diagnosed disabilities. A music therapist was contracted through West Music to develop programming based on the individual needs of girls residing at IJH. The groups sing, write music, play musical instruments, practice rhythm and dance, and learn strategies for relaxation.

REAL IMPACT: MUSIC OFFERS GIRLS IN THE JUSTICE SYSTEM A WAY TO REFLECT AND HEAL.

The president of IJH, Carol Jones, describes the impact of music therapy as “very effective in helping the students calm themselves down and stay focused on their programming . . . The kids stress how much they enjoy playing music and working together in their groups.”

WAYPOINT SERVICES “OUTREACH PROGRAM FOR MADGE PHILLIPS HOMELESS SHELTER,” CEDAR RAPIDS: \$1,500

IWF helped provide funds supporting the salary of Waypoint’s outreach support specialist. Launched in 2008, the outreach program is a long-term offering. The program helps women in crisis obtain independent living skills, access educational programs that lead to secure employment and overcome barriers to independence. The ultimate goal of the program is to decrease reoccurrences of homelessness.

REAL IMPACT: ALL PARTICIPANTS SAY GOODBYE TO HOMELESSNESS.

As of February 2009, the support specialist served 44 women, helping them make the transition from shelter housing and providing follow-up support while the women settle into new living arrangements. None of the women have returned to the shelter.

YWCA “GIRLS POWER MENTORING PROGRAM,” AMES AND NEVADA: \$2,800

GIRLS Power pairs sixth- and seventh-grade girls (ages 11 to 13) with Iowa State University (ISU) female mentors for a series of meetings and group activities. Mentors provide positive reinforcement and create opportunities for empowerment. Mentors benefit from increased responsibility and leadership development. Program leaders report interaction with the ISU campus helps break down gender barriers by showing young women exploring diverse careers and opportunities.

REAL IMPACT: GIRLS REPORT INCREASED COMMITMENT TO HIGHER EDUCATION.

SENATOR MARY LUNDBY

Former Senator Mary Lundby, who passed away earlier this year, is remembered as an inspirational leader and public servant. During her two decades of service, Senator Lundby

- Worked tirelessly to raise minimum wage
