


2015: A Year in Review for the IWF

During this season of giving and thanks, we look back with gratitude and appreciation to all of those who supported the work of the lowa Women's Foundation. Because of you, 2015 was a record year for IWF!

Grants

This year we are thrilled to award 16 grants totaling almost \$90,000 to rural and urban communities from Sioux City to Osceola, Des Moines to Dubuque, Fort Dodge to Iowa City. Your generous contributions will reach women and girls across Iowa providing safe housing to survivors of domestic violence and mentorship for women leaving state correctional systems. They will help train aspiring women farmers in entrepreneurship and business planning. The 16 grantee program locations are marked by a black X below.



They will foster a passion for STEM and awareness of STEM careers in underserved middle and high school girls. They will provide vehicles to single mothers, enabling them to drive to work, run errands, and safely transport their children. They will continue to fund a child care training program that has already put 90 refugees to work.



SHE Matters "We Listen, and Iowa Wins"

In an effort to help lowa's women and girls reach economic self-sufficiency, IWF hit the state highways and byways May through August for their *SHE MATTERS: We Listen and lowa Wins Tour*. The IWF leadership traveled over 4,800 miles to 18 lowa communities. These communities are marked by a black X below.



Thirty-seven local partners from community nonprofits, educational institutions and businesses collaborated with the Iowa Women's Foundation bringing to the discussion 266 community leaders recognized for their work with women and girls.

The goals of the IWF SHE MATTERS

Tour were to learn firsthand the most pressing challenges affecting economic self-sufficiency for women (and children) in each community, as well as what initiatives are in place to advance success for women and girls and about the gaps that exist. Community leaders also made recommendations for specific areas or issues where the IWF could



invest to help women and girls achieve economic success.

The data will culminate in a report to be released in early 2016. This report will share the voices and recommendations of the community leaders who participated in the tour stops. The data will represent participants' perceptions of the challenges that lowa women and girls face and what changes are needed to improve their lives economically. The Foundation will use the report to guide its priorities and strategies moving forward. The report will also be shared with community, business and government leaders around the state to inform and drive action towards statewide economic self-sufficiency for women.

Chicks For Change

Chicks for Change is an IWF donor circle based in the Cedar Valley. It was founded over a decade ago by residents of the area who were passionate about the work of the lowa Women's Foundation. The group has raised over \$150,000 for the IWF.
